1791:



Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution is ratified which states: "A well regulated militia, being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arn shall not be infringed.

Prohibited Washington D.C. residents from owning handguns

THE FIREARM OWNER'S PROTECTION ACT OF 1986

Amended the NFA definition of "silence to include combination of parts for silencers and prohibited the transfer or possession
of fully automatic post-1986 firearn

manufacturing, importing and selling of armor piercing hander iercing handgun mmunition.

THE BRADY HANDGUN VIOLENCE ACT OF 1993

Established the NICS and instituted day waiting period before a firearm ale could be made (some provisions overturned in 1998) sale d 1

VIOLENT CRIME CONTROL & LAW ENFORCEMENT ACT OF 1994

Instituted a ban on 19 types of semi-automatic rifles, including AR-15s, Tec-9s, and AK-47s and (expired in 2004)



DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA V. HELLER (2008)



Reversed the 32-year -old handgun ban in Washington D.C.

BUMP STOCK BAN (2018)

The Department of Justice clarifies the definition of "machinegun" to include bump stock-type devices and required them to be destroyed or turned in to the ATF.
